What a Summer this has been! I hope this message finds you well and staying cool in this heat. The farmers tell me the weather has been great for the corn and beans, but as a human being who enjoys nice and comfortable summer days, I sure hope that corn tastes great.

As for an update for our congregations, I would like to start by thanking both Emmanuel and St. John's for providing me with the opportunity to take sabbatical in the month of June. I know many of you were thinking I spent the entire time away in Pennsylvania, however we only spent the first week there and returned to Ohio for the remainder of the month. While I was in Pennsylvania I was able to connect with some friends I have not seen in many years from my college days, took an unplanned trip to HersheyPark, the first place I ever worked as a high school student, and returned to Lancaster Theological Seminary in order to visit the Evangelical and Reformed Historical Society Museum on the third floor of the Phillip Schaff Library to conduct research on our two historic congregations.

Many of you would be surprised, as I was, that they have a file on each of our congregations filled with some of our milestones over the years. I will be sharing this research with you all on an upcoming date TBD following a joint worship service in the future. While I did not find anything earthshattering, I did find some artifacts and images worth seeing. As I mentioned the remainder of the month was spent in Ohio with a family trip to Great Wolf Lodge in Sandusky, a silent retreat spent at the Jesuit Spiritual Retreat Center of Milford Ohio, and an impromptu trip to see a hot air balloon festival in Ashland. By the end of the month I was more than prepared to return to our church families and my responsibilities in service to Emmanuel and St. John's.

On June 29th Emmanuel hosted our Annual Church Picnic, following a joint worship service and then, not missing a beat, on June 30th I began preparing for our Community Vacation Bible School hosting responsibilities in July. It was a joy to join the team who had already put in a month's worth of work and more as we prepared for July 13th-17th at the Bluffton Family YMCA to head to Egypt in order to learn about Joseph and his amazing experience with God. Having traveled to Egypt as part of my Seminary experience I was very excited to share with the children what it was

like inside of the Great Pyramids in Cairo and how my camel ride around the Pyramids was so much fun. A few of the kids didn't believe me, but after confirming that I was there they seemed amazed. With 90+ children in attendance through the week, 15+ teenagers and young adult volunteers, and an untold number of adult volunteers from our local BAMA congregations, it was a great success. I look forward to see what St. John's has instore for us next year as they take on the hosting in 2026.

As we look to the month of August, I have a family vacation coming up to visit some more family in Myrtle Beach, SC, St. John's is gearing up (pun intended) for a bicycle swap, another family bike ride is scheduled for August 30th, a fellowship trip has been scheduled for that same Saturday to watch the Toledo Mud Hens, and we have one final Summer joint worship service on August 31st. In the meantime, both congregations are raising funds for a BAMA Back-to-School mission for the 25-26 school year, Emmanuel continues to have success on the softball field with our congregations joining together to defend our title for the 3rd year in a row (4 total years of championship), and, as ever, our service to this community continues with our various other missions and outreach.

As has been discussed many times in the past, the septic system is in dire need of updating. Consistory has been working with the EPA on a plan to address our needs in the most affordable and appropriate manner. At the recommendation of the EPA, we are working with a local contractor to pursue installing a holding tank which will be emptied on a regular basis. Due to physical space constraints, the EPA will not approve any other path forward at this time.

The cost of installing and maintaining the holding tank will be significantly less than installing a whole new septic system and should be covered by the current capital campaign funds. If there are any questions about this update, please reach out to Erin Burkholder.

Teacher Position for Release Time/Weekday Christian Education

The applicant is expected to be a committed Christian with a heart for children and willingness to work with children from varied denominational backgrounds as well as no church background. The applicant must have a desire to carry out the Christian Education program mission to give children a dynamic understanding of God through Jesus Christ, His Son, and thus create a desire to respond to faith in love, responsible living, purposeful service and Christian witness.
