#### **PASTORS PAGE**

It has been 7, almost 8, months since Emmanuel and St. John's made an historic decision to share a Pastor once more and no matter where I go or what group I am with I always hear the same question, "How's it going with two churches?". My response, "So far so good.". I would be lying if I said it has not been difficult at times and challenging at others. I am certainly more tired on a Sunday afternoon and evening, however my family has been very supportive in offering time for "daddy rest," as Lucy likes to call it. I have not, however, rested in trying to better know the congregation of St. John's, find a balance between the two with regards to the logistics of things like Holiday Worship, New Membership, and even Congregational/Annual Meetings, and accustom myself with the two very different leadership models.

All in all I do believe that this has been a very positive move for both congregations and I continue to look forward to the possibilities of the future. Emmanuel is looking at another Fall Festivities Day in October and Fall Fish Fry in November, the dates for which I have already been asked by many members of our community who look forward our bi-annual meal. It is exciting to know that we will once again have the dine-in or carry-out options available with the inclusion of some more fryers which have been donated to us in order that we might keep up with the demand. In the springtime our carry-out orders almost doubled our dine-in orders, freeing up space and time for those who crave fellowship, while also providing meals for those who are not able to make it for the full dine-in experience. 'The Wait' has always been our biggest challenge and with this new model of operation in place we have drastically cut down on that wait time. We will be looking for a big volunteer push in November and I know this congregation will respond well to that as it always has.

Another opportunity for this congregation to rise to the occasion will be in preparation for the holidays and our annual Buckeye Candy Sale. Along with members of the community looking for those Fish Fry dates, we have also established ourselves in the Christmas Season as being a great source for some wonderfully tasty Buckeye treats, and so people are asking if we are planning on selling them again. By happy circumstance our Grand Master General of Buckeyes, Sherry Stratton, and her Chocolate and Peanut Butter platoon will be busy preparing for the wedding of Emily Stratton and so will be unavailable at the time of baking this year. Thankfully, members of the consistory, Jesse Owsley and Logan Fruchey, have stepped up to keep our great fundraiser going and will need some volunteers to help. This has, and will always be, a fundraiser of the Congregation, much like the Fish Fry. We will need everyone who can to step up and fill-in where needed this year in December.

As for our worship plans this holiday season, both congregations have agreed to have a joint worship service on Sunday, December 18<sup>th</sup> at Emmanuel beginning at 10:30 for our Youth Christmas Program and then a joint worship service on Sunday, December 25<sup>th</sup> at St. John's beginning at 10:30 in order to accommodate for holiday plans and for the health of your pastor, who doesn't necessarily relish the idea of 4 services in 24 hours' time ©.

And finally, the leadership of both congregations continue to look for ways to serve the community of Bluffton and have provided new commitments to our local Release Time Program. Both consistory's will be donating \$150 for the purpose of paving the way for students to attend Release Time and supporting this 90+ year old program of which we have been a part from its conception. With this financial commitment we join with the other congregations in our community who are making similar commitments as we have all recognized and benefited from such a program among our youth. We continue to need volunteer walkers for this program, which has moved locations to Bluffton First United Methodist Church across the road from its previous location at First Mennonite. I would ask that you continue to keep the Release Time Program in your prayers and thank you all for the ways in which you have supported it through the years.


