THE FALL SEASON IS THE TIME WE HARVEST THE CROPS AND PREPARE FOR WINTER. BIBLICAL PHRASE "WE REAP WHAT WE SOW"

God inspired Paul to write: "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up" (Galatians 6:7-9).

As another church calendar year begins I find myself excited about the things we have accomplished and the things are working toward in the future. We have continued a wonderful partnership in ministry with St. John's UCC in town having now had another opportunity to gather over the summer for an outdoor service and church picnic, a more recent presentation at an impromptu joint worship service at St. John's with Barb Plaugher sharing her missionary work and ministry, and successful work in supporting local ministries like the Bluffton Community Assistance Program through the Bluffton Food Bank and Weekday Christian Education or Release Time. Going forward this partnership will see another joint worship service this month as well as some joint worship services during the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

When we look to the future, our congregation will have the opportunity to serve the Thanksgiving Dinner at the Community Meal this year, our Fall Fish Fry already has some inner workings churning and the community is abuzz with anticipation as I get the question, "When is the next fish fry?" all the time when I'm out, our Fall Festivities Day and Trunk-or-Treat is beginning to shape up and will have the addition of St. John's assistance, our annual Christmas Buckeyes fundraiser will once again happen this year, and our Christmas Program will be hosted here at Emmanuel in December.

Were we to rewind time and go back before a Global Pandemic our congregation was very excited about the successful mission trip we took to Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Our work with the Meals on Wheels of Lancaster County was trend setting for them as they invited at least two more volunteer groups, that I know of, to do similar work after we had left. Going to the clients homes and meeting the other needs they had was very welcome and eye opening, not only for those who serve in Lancaster, but also for those who were able to go on the trip. At that time I had established the idea that every 2 years we would take a mission trip, alternating between a smaller "local trip" somewhere in Ohio and a larger "abroad trip" somewhere out of state, not know that there would be a great challenge to this plan.

On the other side of the Global Pandemic, yet still with valid concerns, we find ourselves to be in a position to pick this program up once more. There have been quite a few questions and interested parties in this missional work and so this winter I will be looking for help to research possible smaller "local trip" options for a Mission Trip in 2024. I would imagine that Emmanuel would be planning this trip, while inviting members of St. John's to join. Funds for that trip would come from our respective congregations' collections and Missions funds, however, more importantly, our work would be meaningful and our connections would be strengthened with one another again. Please keep your ears pealed and calendars open to this ministry for 2024 if you think you would be interested.

Finally, I have always said that this quarterly message would serve as a finger on the "pulse" of the congregation for me and I would say at this time that we are quite healthy considering all that we have faced in the past few years. We might identify that our numbers in attendance have not returned to "pre-covid" status, however with our service being online our analytics have shown that anywhere from 4 to 10 others have joined us from week to week online. Also, those numbers only show us the number of computers accessing, not the total viewing the screen at the time, which could make the number even higher. Even so, we are not at the 50 to 60 from before, or even the 70 to 80 from decades ago. I assure you, we are not alone in this. Every

congregation, in our community of Bluffton, outside of our community in Bluffton, everyone is proclaiming the same thing.

How do we change this? The same way we have always changed such a thing, invite your friends and your family to attend. Let them know about the work we are doing and the ways in which they might be able to join us. Get excited about what you are doing and seeing. Talk about your faith. Talk about your faith community. Everyone is looking for the same thing in this world, a place to belong. A place to call home. Our doors are open and there is a place for others to join us, but they don't know that they can come unless you invite them. So let's keep doing what we do best, let us continue finding new ministries and missions, and let us spread the Gospel to all. Thanks be to God. Amen.




