Snow is falling on the ground as I write this letter to you and the season of Christmas is only a few short days away. Christ is coming and the Light of the World is breaking through! Praise be to God! There is pretty much everything to look forward to in 2021 for our congregation, our community, our society, and humanity as a whole. We are, just now, on the brink of the next phase of living with a global pandemic, one in which we have a vaccine to help protect us from the infectious disease COVID-19. Yet the changes and effects of this catastrophic and global event will still play out in the months to come.

One of the questions my ministerial/pastor groups are beginning to ask is, "What will we keep with us and change after this is 'over'?" To be honest I don't know that this will ever be completely over. Still the Body of Christ lives on in the actions, words, and deeds we carry out in our lives for one another. The Church will live on and it will live




