

News from the UCC Cleveland office Sale of UCC building in Cleveland complete; new office space nearly ready

The United Church of Christ no longer owns property in downtown Cleveland.

The sale of the 700 Prospect Avenue building, <u>announced in April</u>, was officially completed as planned on Tuesday, May 31. The purchase price was \$4.5 million, said UCC General Counsel Heather Kimmel, who handled the closing along with General Minister and President John Dorhauer.

Dorhauer said proceeds from the sale — after some final expenses — will be added to the national setting's unrestricted endowment to help fund the mission of the United Church of Christ.

Meantime, the church is making final preparations to move into leased space in another downtown building a half-mile away, at 1300 E. 9th Street. The build-out of offices there now awaits city inspection. An occupancy permit is expected in July.

Assets for mission

The sale ends a years-long process, <u>led by the UCC Board</u>, to decide whether or not to keep 700 Prospect. The closure of the building in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the uptick in remote and hybrid work, added new aspects to that process.

"As we look to position our organization for future success, we seek to invest more resources in mission and personnel and fewer resources in property," Dorhauer said. "

Pocket prayer shawls, also called prayer squares and prayer cloths, are small enough to be tucked into pockets, purses and pillowcases.

History of Prayer shawls are known the world over, and come in many forms. It seems that the first Christian, formal prayer shawl ministry began in Hartford Connecticut in 1998. Since then, the practice has spread far and wide, bringing comfort to thousands. Whether they are called Prayer Shawls, Comfort Shawls, Peace Shawls, or Mantles, etc., the shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient. The intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. Upon completion, a final blessing is offered before the shawl is sent on its way. Many blessings are prayed into every stitch.
