As many of you are already aware and may have already experienced, depending on when you read this article, on April 8th we will experience a total eclipse here in Bluffton. According to the Bluffton Chamber the last time this happened was in 1806 and the next time this will happen will be in 2099. In 1806 Napoleon Bonaparte was still Emperor of France, future President of the United States Andrew Jackson famously dueled Charles Dickinson (not to be confused with the author Charles Dickens who was born 6 years later), and the Holy Roman Empire finally came to an official end when Francis II renounced the title and became Emperor of Austria.

All of these events are ones in which we read about in our history books today, feeling that we are worlds apart. By comparison 2099 doesn't seem to be so far removed. A mere 75 years from now Bluffton and the surrounding area will once again become a hot spot of activity for those who will be amazed by the moon passing in front of the sun. I wonder then what they will be reading about today. Will they be amazed that this was the time when ______? Or will there be people living on the moon, waving down at the earth as they pass by little old Bluffton Village?

Such events are transformative and important because they mark the passage of our time. For Bluffton, Ohio, or to be more historically accurate, first named Shannon, Ohio, 1806 was 25 years away from being established. Our village, let alone our two historic congregations, did not properly exist the last time this event took place and we would only hope and pray that it will still exist the next time it happens.

Here is why I mention this; first, because right now this seem to be all we can talk about and hear about on the news around here. We are excited and yet it seems like the world is ending, or not, on April 8th, as people from all over might descend like locusts upon us, or not, causing us to lose internet signals, phone signals, gas prices to rise, streets to be littered with cars and people, or not. I hope one day that others will look back upon this article and laugh at how concerned we were about nothing. And boy do I hope it's not cloudy that day. Second, and more importantly, I wonder what we as congregations, church families, might be able to accomplish in 75 years.

Emmanuel just held its annual Spring Fish Fry feeding 360 meals to our neighbors, our friends, our families, and complete strangers who stopped by because they heard about it on the radio or saw it on social media. St. John's looks to start up a bike ministry in the community of Bluffton, seeking to provide space and opportunity for children and adults alike to experience the joy of gliding along the many bike and walking pathways which the Bluffton Lion's Club have been constructing. Our outreach from both congregations continues through Church World

Service and giving to Our Church's Wider Mission funds. The lives we have touched, the people that we have helped, here at home and abroad, are truly innumerable. But 75 years from now, what more could we do? What will the next total eclipse cover here in Bluffton?

It is exciting to think about the future, but it is a future which we must work towards, month after month and year after year. None of this can be taken for granted. We live in a place that didn't exist in 1806, so who will we be in 2099? We have been established for a purpose. And as congregations in the Church of Jesus Christ that purpose is to spread the Gospel, to share our blessings upon others, to provide for those who are without, and to support those who are in need. I look forward to that future, one which many of us will not be playing a part in at all. But it will be one for which our descendants and all those who come after us might be able to say, we helped to establish. May our work in the community of Bluffton continue and may Bluffton continue to thrive. Thanks be to God.
