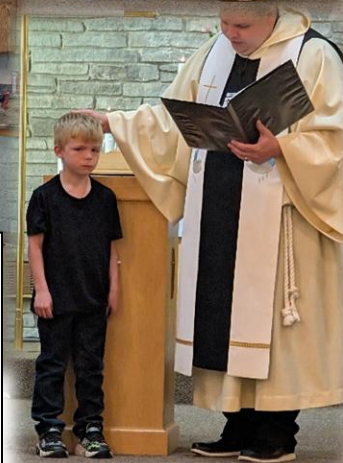

DESIGNATED MINISTER CALLED BY CABINET (Taking over responsibilities that Dan Busch had)

The Cabinet of the Northwest Ohio Association has issued a call to Rev. Dr. Jon Komperda to serve as Designated Association Minister. Rev. Komperda's selection was recommended by the NWOA Search Committee, approved unanimously and with enthusiasm. He will hold the title of "Designated" for a period of two years, at which time both Rev. Komperda and the Cabinet can determine whether he will become the "settled" Association Minister.

Here are words of greeting from Rev. Komperda to us all; "God's abundant blessings, Northwest Ohio Association! The Apostle Paul assures us that we have been blessed in Christ with every spiritual blessing. For 16 years, I have been grateful to have discovered one blessing after another among the people of the NWOA, and now I am excited to cultivate those blessings with you as the Spirit of Pentecost continues to stir up the message and mission of Jesus in and through our churches."

Rev. Komperda will begin his work for the Association on August 4. He and Bridge Association Minister Don Giesmann will work together for a week or

two as Rev. Komperda gets settled into the job, after which Rev. Giesmann's tenure will come to a close.

The position of Designated Association Minister will be a three-quarter time position, and Rev. Komperda will remain as pastor of Point Place UCC on a quarter time basis. He will conduct business in a hybrid setting, which means he will be available by phone, but will not be in the Association office every day. The position not being full time is a consequence of declining revenue to the Association.

Rev. Komperda comes to us with a dual major Bachelor's of Arts in Religion and English from Wittenberg University, a Masters of Divinity from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (Deerefield, IL), and a Doctorate degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. He has been the full time pastor at Point Place for the past 15 years.

"I believe God's hand was in our search, having sent us a candidate from within the Northwest Ohio Association who understands the demographics and geography of the area," said Search Committee Chairman Jay Scott. "To borrow a phrase, we are in a 'season of change,' and Jon understands part of his role will be to guide us through this time."

An installation service and reception for Rev. Komperda will be planned for some time in September.
