Message from the consistory

I cannot believe that we are approaching the end of the year 2020. When I was nominated as Consistory president at the beginning of the year, I had no idea what I was getting into. Thanks to the help and support of Bev Shepler (previous Consistory President), Pastor Jeremy and the rest of the Consistory members, they were able to guide me and helped me develop some leadership skills. I feel that the Consistory was able to get a lot of things accomplished even though COVID threw a wrench in some of our plans. Thanks to the help of Jeff Bowlus, we are now able to broadcast the online services. This is something that we plan to continue with even after the pandemic is over. Rain spouts were added to the shelter house, the parking lot was topcoated and patched, the drainage issue in the parking lot was repaired, some dead trees were cut down in the woods, and we allowed Chase Eikenbary to use the fellowship hall to hold Jazzercise classes with her making a monthly donation to the church.. We recently held our first drive thru Fish Fry that ended up being very successful. We ended up serving over 300 people. Thank you to all who helped get supplies, set up inside & outside, fried the fish, prepared the sides, served the food, washed dishes, sold tickets, directed traffic, cleaned up, gave a monetary donation and to those of you who purchased a meal. I am amazed and so thankful for all of you that have helped and volunteered your time and talents this year. It is greatly appreciated.

With the rise of outbreaks of COVID in our area and a recommendation from the Heartland Conference and our Association to temporarily close our doors and move to online services, the Consistory members have been in discussion if this is something we want to do at this time. We know how important it has been for people to attend services and to get back to a somewhat normal routine. As I am writing this letter today on 11/23, the Consistory feels that due to the smaller congregation attending each week and the guidelines we have set forth regarding COVID safety, we would remain open for the in-person church service on 11/29 (which is the annual Budget meeting). After this service we will then reevaluate our options. Again thank you to Connie & Dick Baker for keeping the church clean and sanitized for our weekly services. For those of us who are attending services we must remain vigilant and wear a mask in order to protect others and ourselves from COVID 19 and continue to practice social distancing. If you are attending with immediate family you can sit side by side, otherwise please space out at least 6 ft from each other and try not to congregate before and after services.

To me December is one of my favorite times of the year. I love Christmas music, and I feel that people seem to be happier, friendlier, and more giving. I will be sad if we would need to shut down the in person services during the holiday season, but I realize that we need to take into consideration that our own health and the safety of others should be our main concern. **Until we do make a final decision, if you feel more comfortable attending the online services, it is totally understood.**

One of my biggest fears in being the Consistory President was having to reach out to our members to ask for money, especially during these trying times. With that being said, December is normally the biggest month for our church's offerings. With the pandemic this year, our attendance is significantly less which means our offerings have been less. With a threat of having to close down again, I am afraid that we may fall short of meeting the 2020 budget. In 2 Corinthians 9:7, (NLT) the verse reads: "You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. 'For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." This will allow you to automatically withdrawal money from your account directly to the church's account.
